"Reopening Your Pathway to Success": Health and Safety Plan APPROVAL FORM

Anticipated Joint Operating Committee (Board) Approval: 8-11-20

The Steel Center for Career and Technical Education's (SC-CTE) Health and Safety Plan outlines our school's instructional and non-instructional school reopening activities for the 2020-2021 school year and was created in concert with guidance and information from: PA Department of Health, PA Department of Education, Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, and Allegheny County Health Department. All school activities are informed by Governor Wolf's Process to Open Pennsylvania.

The Governor's plan has categorized reopening into three broad phases: red, yellow, or green. These designations signal how counties and/or regions may begin easing some restrictions on school, work, congregate settings, and social interactions. Depending upon the public health conditions in our county, there could be additional actions, orders, or guidance provided by the Pennsylvania Department of Education (PDE) and/or the Pennsylvania Department of Health (DOH) designating our county as being in the red, yellow, or green phase. There may be times that our county may not experience a straight path from a red designation, to a yellow, and then a green designation. Instead, cycling back and forth between less restrictive to more restrictive designations may occur as public health indicators improve or worsen in our local area. The *Steel Center for Career and Technical Education's* Health and Safety Plan accounts for changing conditions to ensure fluid transition from more to less restrictive conditions in each of the phase requirements as needed.

SC-CTE's Health and Safety Plan is subject to change in order to reflect and be consistent with the current status of public health conditions within Allegheny County and the Commonwealth. To assure that the Health and Safety Plan is current and up-to-date, SC-CTE will continually monitor all orders, rules, regulations, guidance and other relevant information issued by the Office of Governor, the Department of Health, the Department of Education, the Department of Community and Economic Development, the Allegheny County Health Department, our member school districts, local authorities and other agencies or departments having jurisdiction over SC-CTE. Based on the most current information available, SC-CTE's Health and Safety Plan will be updated.

Roles and Responsibilities for Health and Safety Preparedness and Response Planning

- Prevent accidents, injuries, and work/school-related illnesses in the schools.
- Create and implement health and safety policies in accordance with the latest legislation and to ensure that these policies are implemented by staff.
- Create and implement health and safety procedures/protocols/practices in accordance with the latest guidance and recommendations for the Department

of Health (DOH) and Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and to ensure that these procedures/protocols/practices are implemented by staff.

- Create a Health and Safety Plan and ensure it is regularly updated, and reflects any changes to the law and/or guidance from federal, state, and local health officials. It's their responsibility.
- Ensure that each member of staff is aware of and adheres to the Health and Safety Plan.
- Provide regular inspections and risk assessments, and ensure that any hazards or defects are rectified immediately.
- Maintain records and thoroughly investigate any accident, community spread illness, and recommend any improvements in health and safety standards if required.
- Provide training to all staff in health and safety issues, and advising them on protective clothing and equipment where necessary.
- Serve as the key point of contact for any member of staff who has a query or concern regarding the health and safety of the workplace.
- Work closely with management, as well as health and safety inspectors.

Summary of Responses to Key Questions:

- How will you ensure the building is cleaned and ready to safely welcome staff and students?
 - The building had received the summer cleaning and disinfection process which began on June 9, 2020. All spaces
 occupied by staff and students were thoroughly cleaned, followed by a disinfection process utilizing a disinfectant that is
 effective against the coronavirus.
- How will you procure adequate disinfection supplies meeting OSHA and CDC requirements for COVID-19?
 - SC-CTE has purchased disinfection supplies through our approved vendors and that meet OSHA/CDC requirements for COVID-19 cleaning and sanitizing.
- How often will you implement cleaning, sanitation, disinfecting, and ventilation protocols/procedures to maintain staff and student safety?

As the school year begins, two shifts of maintenance/service employees will clean each assigned space daily. They will also disinfect high touch areas on a daily basis. In addition to the daily cleaning, they will perform a deep cleaning on Tuesday nights/Wednesday while students are working remotely, and Friday nights.

- What protocols will you put in place to clean and disinfect throughout an individual school day?
 - SC-CTE has invested in additional disinfectant sprayers, electrostatic sprayers, and no-touch restroom cleaners to quickly disinfect larger areas during the school day and in between sessions. In addition, specific members of the maintenance/service employee staff may be reassigned to work during the school day to maintain cleanliness of the building while the building is occupied. CTE teachers will perform targeted cleaning in their program areas (desks, Chromebooks, door handles, etc.) between morning and afternoon sessions; all other employees will perform targeted cleaning in their assigned work areas.
- Which stakeholders will be trained on cleaning, sanitizing, disinfecting, and ventilation protocols? When and how will the training be provided? How will preparedness to implement as a result of the training be measured?
 - All Steel Center staff members will receive professional development and training in two ways. They are trained virtually
 utilizing Global Compliance Network (GCN) and in-person, either one-on-one, or in a small group. All training is
 documented, and kept on file to verify it has been sufficiently completed.
 - Non-custodial staff members will be trained in whom to contact if a suspected case of COVID19 appears, or if contact tracing leads to locations within the SC-CTE campus.
 - Training will begin in July 2020 for maintenance/service employee staff and will continue throughout the summer, and/or as more relevant information is provided by the CDC, PA Dept. of Health, W.H.O., or Allegheny County Health Department.
 - Measurement and quality control of the cleaning process is documented electronically utilizing Smart Inspect or similar Application on smartphones and tablets. This allows SC-CTE to monitor the quality of the cleaning and disinfection through inspection, report, and performance trending.

Summary of Responses to Key Questions: How will the LEA strategically deploy instructional and non-instructional staff to ensure all students have access to quality learning opportunities, as well as supports for social emotional wellness at school and at home?

- SC-CTE has begun a strategic implementation of the Canvas Learning Management System. Professional Development strategies began in July and will continue throughout August to educate all teachers about effective use of Canvas. This professional development will continue with additional sessions geared towards support staff, students and parents.
- SC-CTE expects to implement its use of Canvas for all students, and is working with our member school districts to ensure all students have access to a device to work on learning materials remotely. The school is purchasing additional webbased and e-learning instructional materials to support CTE programs where the learning was more traditional with paper textbooks. When necessary, accommodations will be provided for students who need printed materials.
- The Work-Based Learning Coordinator, and the School Counselor will have access to Canvas and will provide appropriate supports and resources to students using this platform as well as posting the information on the SC-CTE website.
- Steel Center is implementing the "Chill Project" through Allegheny Health Network to provide trauma informed mental health services and supports for Steel Center students.
- We will continue to use the Learning Facilitators to support students with an IEP.
