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Program Description: This program is a combination of subject matter and experiences designed to prepare individuals for entry-level employment in a related health occupation under the supervision of a licensed health care professional. It is a cognitively demanding program that is very heavily weighted in theory work. The majority of class time is spent reading, taking notes, and completing rigorous written assignments. The class is fast paced, often covering 2-3 topics at a time. Instruction consists of core course content and may include clinical experiences in a health related occupation. The core curriculum consists of an introduction to health careers, anatomy and physiology, medical terminology, infection control, legal and ethical aspects of health care, communications, and basic care skills. The class is cumulative so students must retain what they learn and build upon it to be successful in the program. Instruction in Phlebotomy and Pharmacy Technology may be offered following the first year as long as the student maintains a C average or better. Both of those programs are highly demanding and require an extensive amount of focused training and studying, both in class and outside of class, to prepare for the certification exams. Students may have the opportunity to earn certifications in those areas. If a student wishes to participate in a job shadowing/volunteering opportunity, then he/she needs to have a 2 step TB test completed.

Assignments/Testing:

- Weekly assignments are due every Friday as indicated.
- Quizzes are assigned throughout units to measure understanding.
- Tests are given to evaluate understanding at the end of each unit.
- NOCTI testing will be scheduled for all seniors in the spring.
- Certification tests may be completed during the student's junior and senior years, as long as the student has maintained at least a "C" average the first year.
- Students averaging less than a "C" their first year, will repeat the material the next school year.
- Due Dates: Any late work will have a 10% deduction per day late.
- Missed tests will be made up on the students return day unless notes/necessary material were also missed. Students will be given one extra day for each day out to obtain information. Students will be issued a 0 if test is not made up within 1 week.
- Exam costs \$120 for Phlebotomy and \$120 for Pharmacy Technician

Classroom/Lab Rules:

- Students need to have belongings locked in the locker, be seated with supplies, and ready to work at the start of class.
- Full approved uniforms are required Mondays through Thursdays

 - Students may wear white, black, gray long sleeve jersey or lab coat under/over scrubs
 - 2nd and 3rd year students may wear color/print scrubs of choice
