I am writing on behalf of the Builders Association of Metropolitan Pittsburgh, BAMP, in support of Steel Center for Career and Technical Education and the school's effort to to address the critical needs to repair and update its education and training facilities

The Builders Association of Metropolitan Pittsburgh (BAMP) is one of the oldest builders associations in the country. Founded in 1938 by a group of Pittsburgh area home builders as the Home Builders Association of Allegheny County, it has grown to become the largest home builders association in Pennsylvania, serving the home building and related industries throughout the metropolitan Pittsburgh region, including Allegheny, Beaver, Butler, Greene, Washington and Westmoreland Counties. BAMP is affiliated with the National Association of Home Builders (NAHB) and the Pennsylvania Builders Association (PBA). BAMP also has an active NAHB Remodeler's Council that focuses on improving the profession of remodeling and education of home improvement contractors. With an eye toward its future, BAMP sponsors numerous NAHB Student Chapters operating in eight local area career training schools, including Steel Center, which is supported by our charitable foundation, Housing Industry Foundation for Education.

Our involvement with Steel Center has been ongoing for over 30 years. In addition to sponsoring an NAHB Student Chapter, members of BAMP have hosted students on "Days at the Job Site" field trips, served as guest speakers and involved students in community service projects. The PBA Endorsed Trade Program accelerates the placement process for students transitioning into the workforce by requiring curricula that meets industry standards, ensuring adequate facilities for proper hands-on training, assisting in the development of home builder student chapters, facilitating local internships and providing a process for ensuring students can connect with builders. I am pleased to note that Steel Center has participated in this industry endorsement process since its inception and continue to receive the PBA Industry Endorsement.

As part of the endorsement review process, a team of peer educators, administrators and local industry representatives visit the school and makes recommendations, where appropriate, related to program facilities. As far as Steel Center is concerned, past reports have noted the need for increased space related to hands-on training facilities.

As technology and methods for the construction trades are constantly changing, so too must the equipment and training evolve to meet today's requirements and needs. As such it is critically important that training providers continuously update their curriculum and modernize their training facilities to ensure that the students they are educating meet the needs of future employers.

From our perspective, we commend Steel Center for their forward thinking in looking to improve its training facilities for its students in helping provide our industry with the next generation of skilled trades' workers. 
