

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN  
WAYNESBURG UNIVERSITY  
AND  
STEEL CENTER FOR CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION**

**OBJECTIVE OF THE AGREEMENT**

Based on the commonality of purpose and a mutual goal of assuring a quality education, Steel Center for Career and Technical Education and Waynesburg University enter into the following articulation agreement. The primary objective of this agreement is to maximize credit transferability while retaining all Waynesburg academic requirements and providing a rigorous program of study. This agreement will afford students the opportunity to realize their educational goals and enhance their future employability through a curriculum that is both challenging and rewarding.

**TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE AGREEMENT**

This agreement applies to Steel Center for Career and Technical Education (SCCTE) students who have graduated from high school and have completed two or more years of instruction who plan to enter Waynesburg University (WAYNESBURG) in the Exercise Science Pre-Athletic Training Program. WAYNESBURG offers students a five year concurrent program which will lead to a Bachelor of Science in Exercise and a Master of Science in Athletic Training Degree upon completion.

WAYNESBURG credits will be granted to students who have met the following criteria:

- Students must have completed the curriculum as outlined in the SCCTE Program of Studies catalog.
- Students must have earned at least a "B" grade average (3.00/4.00) at SCCTE for the years of instruction completed.
- Students must have a total test score of at least 75% on the appropriate NOCTI Exam. (This will be waived until the exam has been fully implemented into the curriculum).

Upon verification the students who have successfully met the above criteria and upon enrollment at WAYNESBURG, will be awarded a total of seven credits for the following four courses:

BIO 105 (2 credits) – Medical Terminology

HSC 105 (1 credit) – Introduction to Health Sciences

HSC 205 (3 credits) – Sports Medicine Concepts & Injuries

HSC 136 (1 credit) – First Aid and CPR Training

Courses completed at other academic institutions do not affect the nature or scope of this agreement. Said courses will be evaluated according to the Academic Policies of WAYNESBURG regarding transfer credits.

WAYNESBURG will provide an official evaluation of all previously completed coursework and placement of those credits at the point of enrollment. Only those students who matriculate to WAYNESBURG will be granted WAYNESBURG credit.

WAYNESBURG reserves the right to change program requirements and/or transfer equivalents. Notice of changes in program requirements by any party of this agreement must be given in writing in a timely manner. Termination of this agreement may be made by either party and must be in writing.

Students who sign a letter of intent are indicating their interest in attending WAYNESBURG and will be entitled to a waiver of the WAYNESBURG application fee. However, this letter of intent does not obligate students to attend WAYNESBURG. Students who sign a letter of intent must matriculate within three years.

SCCTE will properly advertise and will provide information regarding WAYNESBURG, its academic programs, requirements, and services extended to graduates under the terms of this agreement. SCCTE will communicate with the WAYNESBURG Admissions Office regarding issues and questions posed by participating students.


SCCTE will provide the WAYNESBURG Admissions Office with the names and addresses of SCCTE students who have indicated an interest in attending WAYNESBURG and students who would benefit from major department activity information.

This agreement will be in effect for a minimum of four years and will be reviewed for change and continuation annually.

The undersigned, duly authorized officials, agree to abide by the above terms and conditions.
